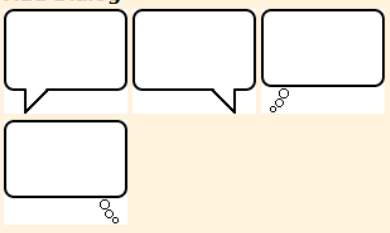
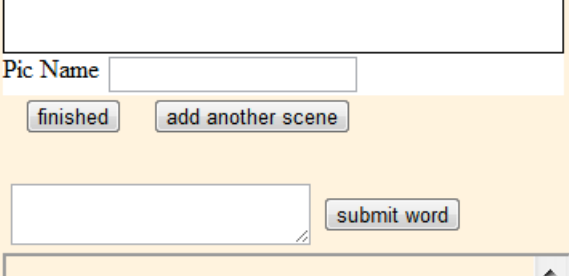
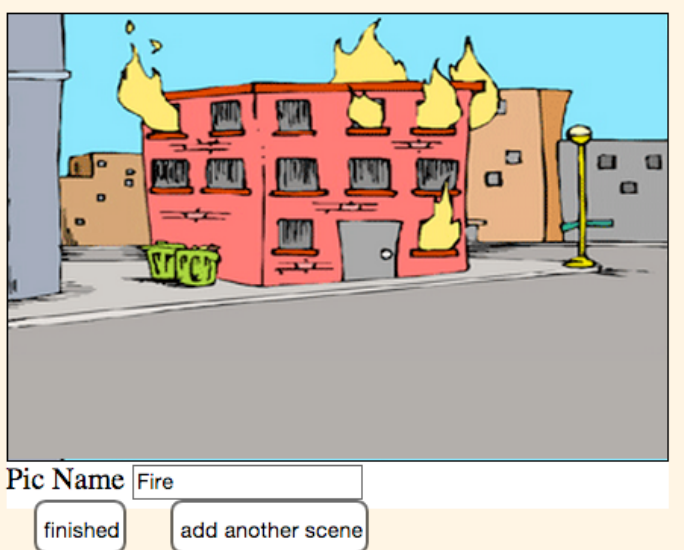

	Open the website in your browser	The strip on the right of the page shows recently created cartoons. You will be working on the left side of the page.
Overview		
Overview	<p>Scroll down the page to see the different areas on the left side.</p> <p>This is the first frame of your comic book. Do not click finished until you are all done.</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">first frame</p>
Overview	<p>This is where you can select your characters, props, aliens and animals. When you click on one of them they will show up in the top box. You can move them around on the background with your mouse (if you don't click finish!).</p>	<p>people props aliens animals </p>
Overview	<p>These are backgrounds you can select.</p>	<p>Add A Background</p>

<p>Overview</p>	<p>These are the speech bubbles. When you click on one, it will show up in the top window frame.</p> <p>It also creates a box for your text just below the top frame (shown in the next frame here)</p>	<p>Add Dialog</p> 
<p>Overview</p>	<p>This is the text box where you can type what you want your character to say. When you click on submit word, the text will appear in the bubble in your scene.</p>	
<p>Ready to get started?</p>		
<p>1</p>	<p>Try one out! Pick a Background and click on it.</p> <p>It will show up in the Pic box at the top.</p>	<p>Example:</p> 

<p>2</p>	<p>Pick a character and click on it once. It will show up in the top frame box. You can use your mouse to move your character around on the screen.</p> <p>DO NOT CLICK FINISHED or you will start all over again.</p>	
<p>3</p>	<p>Add a speech bubble, move it where you want it, and then type your text in the box that appears below the frame, next to the bubble that says submit word.</p> <p>When you are done typing, hit enter to have an empty line.</p> <p>Click on the submit word button when done and the text will appear in the bubble.</p> <p>You can still move the bubble or retype the text.</p>	
<p>4</p>	<p>Add a prop, animal, alien, or another character if you want one.</p> <p>You may need to scroll up and down, or back and forth to see all the options.</p>	

<p>5</p>	<p>When you are done with that scene, click on “add another scene” , and add the background, characters, and more speech bubbles as needed.</p>	 <p>Pic Name <input type="text" value="Fire"/></p> <p><input type="button" value="finished"/> <input type="button" value="add another scene"/></p>
<p>6</p>	<p>Now continue the story, adding more content to it until you feel it is done. Review it one last time. Click on Finished if you are now done with this practice cartoon.</p>	<p>Clicking on Finished will give you a link to a web page where your finished cartoon is located.</p>  <p>You can now give this link to your teacher or insert it onto your blog, webpage, or into an email.</p>

7	<p>You may also be able to save the scenes as images and upload them into another program, such as a PowerPoint show, a Google slides presentation, or even into an infographic program or program like PhotoPeach (used in Digital Images).</p>	<p>copy each scene from the page with a right-click ... save or copy image as...</p>
